

ANU COLLEGE OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS ACCESS SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

Each year the ANU College of Business and Economics ('the College') may offer an award known as the ANU College of Business and Economics Access Scholarship ('the Award').

The objectives of the Award are to strengthen educational outcomes for students, both in terms of skills development and preparation for further study or employment, and to raise awareness of the acute disadvantages that some students face in accessing university education.

Funding for this Award has been provided by the ANU College of Business and Economics.

2. BENEFITS

The value of the Award is stated in your letter of offer. The duration of the Award is for up to four years of full-time study (maximum of 192 units). The Award payment will align to the recipient's academic study load. For example, 24 units' enrolment constitutes 100% of the award payment; 18 units constitutes 75% of the award payment, etc. The Award is paid at the beginning of semester unless otherwise stated in the letter of offer.

The recipient is responsible for making payment of all tuition fees by the prescribed date as set out by the University each session. Recipients of the Award are responsible for the costs of books, study materials, accommodation and all other costs of study.

3. ELIGIBILITY

The Award is available each year to a commencing ANU student who:

- (a) is a domestic student; and
- (b) is a current school leaver in Australia at an Australian High School (or College); and
- (c) receives an offer of admission and will enrol in an undergraduate program offered by the College; and
- (d) is eligible for National Access Scheme (NAS) financial hardship adjustment factors.

4. APPLICATION

All applicants applying for admission through the ANU Admission Scholarship and Accommodation Application System will be automatically considered for the Award based on them meeting the eligibility criteria and electing to be considered for scholarships.

5. SELECTION

Selection is made on the basis of applicants meeting the eligibility criteria and low ICSEA (below 1000). If there are more equally-ranked eligible applicants than there are Awards available, applicants will be ranked according to (in order of priority):

- Severity of financial disadvantage
- Lowest SEIFA

- Total adjustment factors
- Lowest ICSEA

The Award is offered to a student by the University Coursework Scholarships Committee. Details of this committee are outlined in the ANU Coursework Scholarships procedure.

The College reserves the right to make no award if it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit. The College may also vary the number of Awards and/or offer the Award at other times in exceptional circumstances or based on the standard of applications or students (where funds allow).

6. CONCURRENT HOLDING OF AWARDS

A recipient of the Award is permitted to hold concurrent student financial awards as outlined in the ANU Coursework Scholarships procedure.

7. DEFERMENT

The Award cannot be deferred.

8. ONGOING ELIGIBILITY

A recipient of this Award is required to enrol on a full-time (18 or 24 units) or part-time (minimum 6 units) basis per semester.

Recipients are expected to pass in all courses each semester or session.

If a recipient does not pass all enrolled courses in any semester or session a formal warning is sent.

If the recipient does not pass all enrolled courses in a subsequent semester or session they risk having their Award suspended or terminated.

A recipient is given the opportunity to explain their performance and how their performance can be remedied before a decision on the suspension or termination of an Award is made.

9. CESSATION OF AWARD

The Award ceases or should be surrendered:

- (a) if a student no longer meets the eligibility requirements;
- (b) at the conclusion of the period outlined in section 2; or
- (c) on the date on which the recipient withdraws or ceases to attend the University other than for approved absences;
- (d) if a recipient fails to enrol as required in section 8;
- (e) if a recipient transfers to a program not offered by the ANU College of Business and Economics;
- (f) if a recipient fails to meet the minimum academic performance requirements; or
- (g) if a recipient breaches academic or behavioural standards set by the University under the Academic Integrity Policy and/or the Discipline Rule;

whichever is earliest.

10. REPAYMENT OF FUNDS

Subject to the information available at the time, the College Dean (or nominee) may request that the payment for the semester in which the breach of conditions or withdrawal occurs be refunded in part or in full.

11. PROVIDING FALSE OR MISLEADING INFORMATION

Selection for the Award is based on the information provided to the University. The Award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or

relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment for the Award.

12. TAXATION & CENTRELINK

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. Student financial awards may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.

13. ACCOMMODATION

14. PUBLICITY

The recipient may be requested to participate in publicity for the Award from time to time. This may include publicity in the state or territory of residence or of schooling. Recipients may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Award by publishing the names of the recipients. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the ANU College of Business and Economics or ANU Communications and Engagement (ACE).
