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CHRIS AND KERRY MARKS TRAVEL GRANT CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

Each year, the ANU College of Law ('the College') may offer a number of awards known as the Chris and Kerryn Marks Travel Grant ('the Award').

The objective of the Award is to support ANU College of Law students undertaking an Indigenous focussed course offered by the College. It is anticipated that this Award will increase opportunity for ANU students, regardless of their financial means, and further enrich their student experience, cultural competence and learning outcomes as they develop a greater understanding of justice and the legal system, as they impact on Aboriginal peoples.

Funding for the Award has been provided by Chris and Kerryn Marks, who established this Award in recognition of the importance of ANU College of Law working in partnership with Indigenous Australia.

2. BENEFITS

The value of the Award is stated in your letter of offer. The Award is paid in a single instalment upon submission of the final approved travel application for the course, unless otherwise stated in the letter of offer.

The recipient is responsible for making payment of all tuition fees by the prescribed date as set out by the University each session. Recipients of this Award are responsible for the costs of books, study materials, accommodation and all other costs of study and travel costs not covered by the award.

3. ELIGIBILITY

The Award is available each year to a current ANU student/s who:

- (a) is an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or permanent humanitarian visa holder; and
- (b) is enrolled in a Bachelor of Laws (Honours) (LLB(Hons)) or Juris Doctor (JD) in ANU College of Law; and
- (c) has applied, been offered a place in, and intends to undertake one of the courses listed on the ANU Scholarship website.

4. APPLICATION

There is no application as students are automatically considered based on them meeting the eligibility criteria or conditions prescribed under the Eligibility section, and applying for one of the courses listed on the ANU Scholarship website before the advertised application deadline.

5. SELECTION

Selection is made on the basis of applicants meeting the eligibility criteria and the information provided in the application form for the course.

The Award is offered to a student by a selection committee chaired by the Dean (or nominee) which will also include two staff members from the College.

The selection committee reserves the right to make no award if it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit. The selection committee may also vary the number of Awards and/or offer the Award at other times in exceptional circumstances or based on the standard of applications or students (where funds allow).

6. CONCURRENT HOLDING OF AWARDS

A recipient of the Award is permitted to hold concurrent student financial awards as outlined in the ANU Coursework Scholarships procedure.

7. DEFERMENT

The Award cannot be deferred.

8. ONGOING ELIGIBILITY

A recipient of this Award must remain enrolled in the course referred in section 3 (c). If there are circumstances beyond the control of the recipient that prevents the recipient from fulfilling this requirement, the Dean of the ANU College of Law may allow the recipient to retain the Award.

9. CESSATION OF AWARD

The Award ceases or should be surrendered if the recipient:

- (a) no longer meets the eligibility requirements or ongoing eligibility requirements;
- (b) fails to complete the course which the Award was given to support;
- (c) withdraws or ceases to attend the University other than for approved absences prior to completing the course which the Award was given to support;
- (d) breaches academic or behavioural standards set by the University under the Academic Misconduct & Discipline Rules;

whichever is earliest.

10. REPAYMENT OF FUNDS

Subject to the information available at the time, the Dean of the ANU College of Law may request that the payment for the semester in which the breach of conditions or withdrawal occurs be refunded in part or in full.

11. PROVIDING FALSE OR MISLEADING INFORMATION

The Award is based on the information provided to the University. The Award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment for the award.

12. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis section 7 of these Conditions of Award may be varied by the Dean on the recommendation of the Chair of selection committee.

13. TAXATION & CENTRELINK

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. The Award may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.

16. PUBLICITY

The recipient may be requested to participate in publicity for the Award from time to time. This may include publicity in the state or territory of residence or of schooling. Recipients may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Award by publishing the names of the recipients. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the ANU College of Law or ANU Communications and Engagement (ACE) of the University.

17. DISCLOSURE AND DONOR CONTACT

For the purposes of reporting on the impact of awards, the name, program name and demographics (for example: age, country or town of residence) relating to a recipient of the Award may be disclosed to donors supporting the Award. This will not include recipient contact details. The recipient may be asked to write a personal note of thanks or to meet with donors. Any contact between a donor and a recipient will be facilitated by the ANU Advancement Office or an authorised representative of the University.
